Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Let us fix our eyes on Jesus" This is what we are doing for the entire month of March here at St. Paul's. We are quickly moving through the season of Lent . . . and the month culminates with the most important Day in the church year: "The Day of Resurrection!" Yes, we must fix our eyes on Jesus not only in church, but every day of our earthly lives.

To help in this spiritual journey and life, we are fixing our eyes on Jesus each Wednesday at 10am or 6pm in our midweek Lenten services. We are following Jesus in His passion, learning so many lessons from each "Paradox of the Passion," for we need to grow in faith and life in seeing Jesus' passion and letting His Spirit have its way with us!

As we move through Lent towards Holy Week, we grow in understanding that the events of that Holy Week nearly 2000 years ago were events that changed the world in many ways and opened up the everlasting Kingdom of Christ to all believers. Jesus' triumphal entry fulfilled the prophetic Scripture on the prophet Zechariah. The cleansing of the temple dealt with the prophetic words of Jeremiah 7. The institution of the Lord's Supper fulfilled the Word of God spoken in Jeremiah 31. The encounter in the Garden of Gethsemane, with all the disciples fleeing fulfilled the words found in Zechariah 13. The cross Jesus bore the next day fulfilled prophetic words of Psalm 22 and Isaiah 53. In this Holy Week, God accomplished what He had promised for centuries and millennia. As Jesus said, "The Scriptures cannot be broken."

Of course, the most important event of Holy Week took place on early Sunday morning with the empty tomb, the resurrection victory of Christ Jesus over Satan, sin, and death. This greatest of Days in the church year brings us a hope that will never disappoint or put us to shame! Without the resurrection, all of the sinful realities of this life would simply be our destiny with no hope beyond the suffering, sickness, sin and death, of t his life.

So plan to worship regularly this month! Plan to come to all of the Holy Week services and know that your soul will be blessed. Indeed, every child of God should be in worship on Easter Sunday, to rejoice in and be strengthened by the resurrection of Christ, our Lord. I can hardly wait to say, "Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!" Until Easter Sunday . . . and even beyond, "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus!" (Hebrews 12)

The Paradox of the Passion A Lenten Series on the Passion of the Christ Lent – The Year of our Lord, 2024

par-a-dox - a person, situation, or action having seemingly contradictory qualities

The life of our Lord Jesus Christ is just filled with many a paradox. He is both true God and true Man. He is eternal, yet was born of a virgin in a particular time and place. He is the almighty God, but appeared so weak, bleeding and dying on the cross. Yet, there is much to be learned from all these paradoxes, especially in the passion of our Lord.

March 31 (Sunrise): The Paradox of Light from Darkness – John 20:1-18

March 31 (Easter): The Paradox of Life from Death - Luke 24:1-12

Bible Studies

Thursday Morning Bible Class

Thank you all who have been coming to Thursday Morning Bible Study, we have been so blessed to have you! Now would be a wonderful time to join us if you have not been attending because we have just finished up covering the Minor Prophets and are changing our subjects. We are now voting for what the next Bible study will be out of the following options-

1 Peter-We live in a nation that is becoming less and less Christian. The first letter of Peter is beneficial in many ways, but it speaks to us today in how do we live as Christians in a world that is not Christian. He covers such things as who are we as the people of God, and what is our role in the world. He also addresses how we are to relate to our friends, coworkers and loved ones who are both Christian or not Christian. 1 Peter is truly a helpful book for Christians as we navigate the world around us.

Church as God's Family- We often describe the Church as God's family, but we don't often understand as what this means. This study will go over the different kinds of relationships God has with his church as Father, Husband and Brother, as well as what this means in our relationships with one another.

Prayer- Does God really listen? Is my prayer good enough? Why doesn't he answer me when I pray? If God already knows what I am going to pray for, as well as my answer, then what is the point of praying? These are questions that Christians have struggled with. This Bible Study would answer these questions, as well as giving practical guides and tips that would aid any Christian in their spiritual life.



Sharing God's Bounty

The Name that Is Above Every Name

Obedience has become an almost ignored concept. Some parents believe that requiring obedience from their children stifles their creative and emotional development. Many couples remove the word "obey" from the vows that brides give to their grooms. To expect employees to obey their employers is certainly not acceptable.

To God, however, obedience is not only acceptable, it is required. Disobedience to God is what is known as sin. And sin separates. Sin separates us from God and from each other. Sin prevents us from living the abundant life that Christ came to give us (John 10:10). On the other hand, obedience is proof of love: "*If you love me, you will obey what I command,*" Jesus says (John 14:15).

Unfortunately, as sinful beings, we are unable to obey our Lord's commands fully. Even the great apostle Paul struggled with this reality. He confessed, "*I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out*" (Romans 7:18). As he relates his dilemma – the dilemma all Christians face – he asks, "*Who will rescue me from this body of death*?" (For as surely as day follows night, death follows disobedience) He answers exultantly, "*Thanks be to God – through Jesus Christ our Lord*!" (Romans 7:24-25)

Jesus has lived the perfect life in our place. Jesus willingly emptied himself, made himself nothing, "and became obedient to death – even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name" (Philippians 2:7-9).

Jesus did what we cannot do. Jesus triumphed over sin, death, and the devil. Jesus, dead and buried, would not stay there! Jesus has risen! He is exalted to the highest place! He has given us his Spirit, the Counselor, who lives with us and in us (John 14:16-17), to sanctify us for obedience to our Father and service to others. This Spirit equips and enables us to be faithful stewards of the Gospel and all his gifts. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Christian Stewardship is the practice of systematic and proportionate giving of time, abilities, and material possessions based on the conviction that these are a trust from God, to be used in God's service for the benefit of all mankind in grateful acknowledgement of Christ's redeeming love.
